Six to vie for board seats

Six candidates will stand for election to one of three open seats on the board of the Seven Lakes West Landowners Association at the annual meeting on March 19: David Carter, Betty Childers, Mary Anne Fewkes, Ray MacKay, Jo Nicholas, and Blaine Rowland. MacKay currently serves on the board and will seek re-election to his seat; Jan Patton and Lois Rocco will be leaving the board.

The board approved the six nominees, who were vetted by a nominating committee comprised of Jan Patton, Charlie Merical, and Ron Sickenberger, during a December 13 work session.

There is still an opportunity for additional candidates to join the fray through the petition process. The deadline for petition candidates is January 18.

A candidates night is planned

Six candidates will stand for for February 9; *The Times* will ection to one of three open publish interviews with the candidates on the board of the Seven didates in an upcoming issue.

The following brief profiles of each candidate were taken from material supplied by the SLWLA board

David Carter and his family moved to Seven Lakes West in July 2004. He is the Director of FirstHealth EMS, overseeing a \$13 million operation that includes 300 employees and 65 ambulances.

His career in emergency services began in the 1970s and has included management positions in Florida, Texas, and Ohio.

Carter holds an associate degree in nursing, a bachelors degree in business management, and an MBA in strategic leadership.

He has served on the SLWLA

Remembering 2005: The year in review

The Times has traditionally offered a quick summary of the previous year's news in the first issue of each year. Here's a rundown of some of the stories we covered in 2005.

January

As 2005 began, *The Times* published a document authored by the leadership of the Seven Lakes Business Guild, the Seven Lakes Civic Group, and both landowners associations looking at the opportunities and challenges that face the Seven Lakes community and that pledged increased cooperation among those organizations.

The SLWLA approved a proposed ban on jet boats on Lake Auman, touching off a debate that occupied the community until late May.

The SLLA board announced that it

would seek a \$50 across the board dues increase for Fiscal Year 2005-2006.

An SLLA committee studying company police and security, headed by Director Loren Swearingen, recommended hiring a second company police officer and splitting the police and security functions in order to allow Chief Dennis Lombard additional patrol time. The SLLA board adopted the committee's recommendations.

A newly formed judicial committee of the Seven Lakes West Landowners Association [SLWLA] met to consider its first case and gave the owners of a Westside lot 30 days to clean it up.

Of Foxfire villagers responding to a survey on a proposed municipal park, seventy-nine percent were in favor of proceeding with the project.

Lakers turned out at a meeting of the

Moore County Planning Board to oppose a proposed Rural Business rezoning of a parcel at the intersection of NC Highway 211 and Dead Man's Curve Road.

Roberta Robinson was named Seven Lakes Garden Club President for 2005, succeeding Jan Patton in that post. The Gold Capital Chorus named new baord members, including naming Lee Grant President.

Mike and Rachel Boiselle took over the helm of the Coffee Scene in Seven Lake Business Village and Dr. Richard and Bonnie Pasko took over the practice at Seven Lakes Chiropractic.

January deaths included Anne Margaret Pacella, Robert G. MacDougall, Jr. and Nadia D. Grant.

February

Jet boats raised a ruckus at the Feb-

ruary general meeting of the SLWLA, when President Bill Mamel provided space on the agenda for presentations by two residents in favor of permitting jet boats on Lake Auman. Opponents of the craft were unhappy that their views were not represented in the agenda. The SLWLA board decided to hold off on a decision on the issue until new board members were seated after the late March annual meeting.

SLLA Community Manager Dalton Fulcher implemented an 11:00 pm curfew on association parking areas in an attempt to control nighttime partying by large number of young people at Sequoia Point.

The SLLA and SLWA signed a reciprocal recreation agreement for Fiscal Year 2005-2006 that provided West-

Patriot Act is League topic this month

The spirit of freedom is still alive in the United States after the ugly catastrophe of September 11, 2001. There are questions, however, about whether government actions in its aftermath have eroded the foundations of this freedom.

If there are other terrorist attacks, will government policies threaten our civil liberties in the name of security? Are our freedoms built on a foundation strong enough to withstand another attack?

Is the recent extension of the USA Patriot Act essential to defend our nation against hidden terrorist activity? Does Homeland Security require that citizens willingly sacrifice a certain amount of liberty and allow the invasion of privacy?

"In this post September 11th world, it is important to understand the relationship between our civil liberties and the security of our nation at the federal and local levels," says Kay Maxwell of the National League of Women Voters.

In the quest for finding answers to the above questions, the Moore County League of Women Voters has invited Patricia Camp, lawyer, teacher, writer, and civil liberties expert to be the guest speaker at their next luncheon on Tuesday, January 17. Ms. Camp's topic will be "The Patriot Act, how it is used, and ways in which its use may limit our civil liberties and promote racism and fear in the name of

national security."

The public is invited to attend this talk about one of the most important political issues in our country at this time. The event will be held at the Paddock Restaurant of Longleaf Country Club on Midland Road in Southern Pines and will begin promptly at 11:30 am.

Thieves hit Prescription Shoppe twice

The Seven Lakes Prescription Shoppe on McDougall Drive has suffered two break-ins in a little more than a month, and, in both cases, thieves made off with thousands of dollars of controlled substances, including oxycontin, morphine, and oxycondone.

The most recent break-in was discovered by pharmacist Trey Waters on the morning of Tuesday, December 27, according to an incident report filed by Moore County Sheriff's Deputy Jesse Robbins.

Opening the shop after the Christmas holiday, Waters found that the back door had been kicked in and medications stolen. The break-in could have happened at any time during the holiday weekend; the store closed at noon on Christmas Eve. It appeared the rear door alarm had malfunctioned, failing to alert the Sheriff's office of the break-in

Drugs were also taken from the shop during the night of November 20 as part of a crime that may have begun a day earlier.

Just before midnight on Saturday, November 19, three Moore County Sheriff's Deputies responded to an alarm at the Prescription Shoppe and found that someone had broken out the drive-through window, as well as damaging the telephone interface box and the power meter. The deputies surmised that the culprits had hoped to disable the alarm but were unsuccessful. When the alarm sounded after the drive-through window was broken, they apparently fled the scene without taking anything.

The next evening, a deputy checking the shop at around 2:00 am found that screws had been removed from a piece of plywood used to temporarily repair the drive-through window. Upon further investigation, the deputy found the back door unlocked. When Waters arrived on the scene he determined that a large amount of narcotics

and other controlled substances had been taken.

Deputies were able to secure some fingerprints from the scene.

Sheriff Lane Carter told *The Times* on Tuesday that his office is making progress in the investigation of the two break-ins but was not able to provide any details at this time. [Unlike incident reports, details of on-going police investigations are not a matter of public record under North Carolina law.]

He encouraged anyone with information that might be useful to investigators to contact the Sheriff's Office at 947-2931.

School calendar input sought

Moore County Schools will hold a public Calendar Meeting Tuesday, January 10, at 7:00 pm in the Board room of the central office in Carthage.

The purpose of the meeting is to allow public input in the development of 2006-2007 calendars for traditional and year-round schools. A Calendar Committee, composed of both school and community representatives, has developed draft

proposals which will be reviewed at the January 10 meeting.

Becky Cameron, Director of Elementary Curriculum, is heading up the calendar process. "We are encouraging anyone who would like to offer suggestions or input into the development of the calendar to attend this meeting," she said. "We want to hear whatever concerns or comments that anyone may have that will help us in forming a

calendar that best serves the needs of the students in Moore County Schools."

After hearing input in the public meeting, two draft calendars for both traditional and year-round schedules will be finalized and presented to school employees for a vote. The results of the vote will then be presented to the School Board for final approval of the 2006-2007 calendars.



Rhodes tells story behind 'Papa' tribute

For three performances on January 27, 28 and 29, at the historic Sunrise Theater in Southern Pines, audiences in the Sandhills area will have a rare opportunity to see a show that was created in North Carolina by a North Carolina native, that has toured the country for almost two years and is bound for New ence in a positive and creative York at the invitation of the Shubert Organization.

Every artist – an actor, a writer, a poet, a composer, a singer, a painter – or to quote Hemingway in the play, "what-have-you" they're all trying to find that one special artistic outing that will allow them to effect an audi-

As an actor, I had often wondered if I had the discipline to write a play. Over the years, I had written a film documentary, a number of commercials and business films and even a couple of screenplays.

During my career as an actor I had also worked in Hollywood as a "paid writer" for the original "Hollywood Squares." But even if you put all this together, it would in no way equal the writing of a play!

The idea of putting together my own show came about when Michael C. Sapp, the Executive Director of the Odell Williamson Theater, being aware of my professional theatrical background and exposure in film and television, insisted that I give some thought to doing a one-man show. My first love has always been the theatre, so I began the process of trying to find a piece of material that I thought audiences would enjoy and that producers and presenters of theatre around the country would find interesting.

At this time, Peter Lawrence, a friend and well known successful screenwriter called me from out of the blue from California and asked if I would play Ernest "Papa" Hemingway for him in an upcoming project if they could get the finances together. I told Peter I'd love to work with him but I didn't think I looked anything like Hemingway.

Peter replied in his best and original British accent, "Jordan, grow a bloody beard lad and look in the mirror. I've know you for a number of years and you bear a striking resemblance to Hemingway." Peter was right.

I went to the library and began to read various books about this prolific writer. I researched books about Hemingway by A.E. Hotchner, Kenneth Lynn, Gregory Hemingway (one of his sons), H. Lea Lawrence, Jeffrey Meyers and Ernest Hemingway on Writing - Edited by Larry W. Phillips. I conceived an idea of how the play might work in order to cover Hemingway's life. I then called a very good friend and writer, Ken Vose. (Ken's writing credits are (See "Papa," p. 11)

I presented Ken with my idea and asked if he would consider working on the project with me. As it turned out, my friend, Mr. Ken Vose was a big fan of Hemingway's work, knew a great deal about "Papa" and even had some recordings of Hemingway doing readings of his work, some of it unpublished. Our odyssey began. During our research we found many facts about Hemingway's life that were not commonly known by the public.

Ken and I began to write our first draft in July 2001. I had an idea to bridge the scenes in the play with music that would be written and sung by actress/singer Lynn Moore. Ken had a better

Lynn Moore would portray each of the five women in Hemingway's life and each segment of the play would begin with one of the five women. She began her own research of the women and brought life to each by reading a number of books about each woman. Her research included books by Bernice Kert, Alice Hunt Sokoloff, Caroline Moorehead and Hemingway's last wife, Mary Welsh Hemingway.

ry of unsold lots, aside from those in Morganwood, to an individual investor.

The SLWLA board voted to ban jet boats on Lake Auman and announced the formation of a committee to develop a strategic plan for the management of Lake Auman.

The SLLA board approved the installation of speed humps on the Lake Sequoia dam roadway in order to slow traffic across the dam.

Foxfire Village won a \$246,000 matching grant from the North Carolina Parks and Recreation Trust Fund [NCPARTF] for the construction of the Village Green municipal park.

The Seven Lakes Kiwanis honored Ginny Richmond and Frank Hayes with their Human and Spiritual values award.

A Foxfire Village effort to have undeveloped lots cleaned up resulted in the the cleanup of 76 of 80 targeted lots.

Deaths in May included Lois Marie Wood Vaughn, Arthur G. Carlson, Jr., Wendell Brantley Kelly, Jr, and Helen Richardson Norris Hedman.

June

Southside resident Bradly Felix was awarded a Silver Star for bravery in action in Afghanistan.

In a surprise decision Moore County Commissioners voted to drop the county ad valoren tax rate by two cents per hundred dollars of valuation.

The deal that would replace GS Communities as Westside developer unraveled and then came back together, as Realtors® Martha and Peyton Gentry teamed with builders Kathy and Bob Van Houten — all residents of Seven Lakes West — to replace Pinehurst builder Ron Jackson as the buyer in the deal.

Linda Tableman, who had served as legal director on the SLWLA board, resigned, saying she had been inappropriately excluded from negotiations concerning the Master Association and SLWLA's relationship with the developer.

Westsiders debated whether residents should be encouraged to approach neighbors who violate rules directly, rather than immediately reporting the infraction to the SLWLA office.

SLLA Maintenance Director Don Truesdell announced that the association would forego the addition of one- full-time and three part-time summer maintenance workers, saving the association \$54,000.

Foxfire residents faced higher water rates but no increase in property taxes in a 2005-2006 budget passed by the village council.

ABC Law enforcement officers raided a Southside party and cited five for underage drinking.

Seven Lakes native Lisa Mace, Miss Moore County, competed for the Miss North Carolina crown in Raleigh.

Northsider Ken Hodge screened a video production on the history of West End at the West End Presbyterian Church to a full house and glowing reviews

The quarterly water testing was conducted a little behind schedule this fall due to my Achilles tendon accident. The results were very interesting and support my earlier speculation as to the process by which the lake mixes.

Water samples were taken from the same five locations in the lake as always. The sample near the outflow at the dam was extremely high in all nutrients and also displayed the brownish color that occurs when the lake mixes. It had a low Secchi reading of 12 feet visibility, which is as low as it ever gets.

That brown water was the deep stagnant bottom water that was being pulled up on the leeward shore as the surface currents from the strong west wind pushed the clear water to the other side of the lake where it sinks.

The sinking water on the windward shore was still pristine with nutrient levels below detection limits and a Secchi reading of 17 ft. Mixing always occurs during windy weather between Dec. 8 and 31, when the surface water finally reaches the temperature/density of the bottom water. This year it happened on Dec. 11h. The water will now slowly begin to clear until it reaches maximum clarity in late April or early May.

As agreed to by the attendees at the initial session, refreshments will be available at 9AM, with the formal session beginning at 9:15.
