Foxfire Community Watch briefed on gangs

A small but troubling amount of gang graffiti has been seen in Moore County and, according to the Sheriff's Office, many communities have been targeted including West End, Robbins, Southern Pines, Aberdeen, and Vass.

In an effort to engage and inform citizens, Foxfire Village Councilwoman Page Coker invited members of the Moore County Gang Prevention Task Force to attend the Community Watch meeting held on Wednesday, June 17.

Representing the Task Force were Deputies Steve Gore and Bill Flint from the Moore County Sheriff's Office, Russell Jack-

son with Moore County Probation and Parole, and Mike Kimbrell, an investigator with the District Attorney's office.

"This is not an epidemic," stated Kimbrell. "We just want people to be aware and to get information out."

While gangs are a minor problem in this area and for the most part limit their activities to nuisance graffiti, across the nation they are widespread and often much more dangerous. As described in the presentation, gangs though small and localized will frequently affiliate with one of two major groups; Folks Nation or People Nation. In Moore County, those allied as Crips affiliate under the Folks Nation and use (See "Gangs," p. 28)

Committees study Westside gates

Three new ad hoc committees will help Seven Lakes West think through issues - ranging from appearance to ownership — surrounding the front and back entrances to the community.

Infrastructure John Goodman announced the formation of the committees and briefly outlined their assignments, during the Tuesday, June 26 General Meeting of the Seven Lakes West Landowners Association

[SLWLA].

The West Side's Long Range Planning Committee [LRP] has identified a number of issues that need to be resolved at the front entrance. For example, the Association doesn't own the guardhouse; that belongs to the developer. Because much of the property alongside that structure is commercially-owned, there is limited opportunity for the Association to upgrade its appearance. The existing mailhouse needs to be upgraded

Board delays site study for admin building

A decision on where to put a new county administration building will likely be delayed another month because of a tie vote on whether to pay architects LS3P Associates up to \$49,000 to study the suitability and cost of locating the building at the Carriage Oaks Shopping Center on the eastern end of Carthage, versus building it on the 21-acre Grimm property downtown.

Commissioners Tim Lea and Cindy Morgan voted to fund the study during the Board's Monday, June 15 meeting, while Commissioners Nick Picerno and Larry Caddell voted against. Commissioner Jimmy Melton was not in attendance. The tie vote meant Lea's motion to proceed failed, but the question can be brought back up at a future meeting.

Because the Commissioners traditionally do not meet on the first Monday in July, it's likely they won't take up the proposal again until July 20.

A committee headed by Planning Director Joey Raczkoski has been charged with evaluating the two possible sites and bringing a recommendation to the Commissioners. Raczkowski told the Board during their July 8 special meeting that his committee needed additional information from the architects in order to make its evaluation.

LS3P's initial proposal was

for a nearly \$88,000 study of the Carriage Oaks site that would include a schematic design of the building, a schematic design of the site by Land Design, Inc., and a comparative cost analysis. County Manager Cary McSwain worked with the firm to scale back the scope of the study and the costs, resulting in the nearly \$49,000 that was presented to the Commissioners Monday

But even that proposed study was more than McSwain felt the Board needed in order to make a decision about the viability of the Carriage Oaks site.

"We only gave them a week to do this," Commissioner Caddell noted to McSwain. "Maybe we need to give you more time to clear this up.'

But Commissioner Lea, in two separate motions, moved authorization of the work by LS3P and LandDesign as negotiated by the Manager, noting that Raczkowski's committee could not move forward without the information the studies would prevade. Commissioner Morgan seconded both motions, and both failed in two-to-two tie votes.

Clearly frustrated with the lack of progress, Lea said after the votes, "What we need to determine is whether this is going to move forward on the agenda or not; and if the three of you [referring to Picerno, Caddell, Melton] decide not, then we can get it off the agenda."

Robbins Water Committee

Also during Monday's meeting, the Commissioners appointed several members to a joint committee with the Town of Robbins that will evaluate the potential for the county and town to work together to rehabilitate Robbin's mothballed water plant and provide water to the southern end of the county.

Committee members will include County Manager McSwain; Dennis Brobst and Ben Vaughn from Public Works; Jim Westbrook, a financial consultant working part-time in the County Manager's office; Commissioner Caddell and Commissioner Melton.

Robbins had already appointed members to the committee including Mayor Theron Bell, the town manager and planning director, and two town commissioners.

No date was set for an initial meeting of the committee.

In another water-related matter, County Manager McSwain told the Board that he, Public Works Director Brobst, and the managers of Southern Pines

and Aberdeen would be meeting with officials from Scotland County and the City of Laurinburg to explore whether a water treatment facility at an abandoned Westpointe Stevens factory on the Lumber River could be used to provide water to both counties and their municipalities.

Capital Improvement Plan

The Board approved a tenvear capital improvement plan presented by Finance Director

Lisa Hughes and assembled by county department heads working with Hughes and Westbrook.

Hughes noted that the county has never before had a countywide capital improvement plan. The twenty-page spreadsheet includes seventy-three projects ranging from a new water tank in Pinehurst to the new county detention center, new public schools, and new buildings at Sandhills Community College.

Get those garden weeds under control

It's hard to believe that late June is here and the Spring and Summer gardening season is half over. Seasonal showers and adequate moisture have promoted fast plant growth that has produces beautiful flowers and early vegetables from our gardens. With this rapid growth come a number of insects, weeds, grasses, and other pests.

Questions arise on methods for control. Here are a few suggestions:

Different insecticides control different pests. Some are broader spectrum than others also some are safer than others. Two recommended broadest spectrum insecticides are permethrin and orthune. A number of the old standbys, such as malathion, sevin, insecticidal soap, and highly refined horticultural oils are still effective for insect control but there is not one insecticide on the market that will kill all bugs and insects. Follow all labeled directions and restrictions specifically and keep these materials out of our lakes.

If you are tired of digging or pulling weeds there are a number of herbicides available to and grasses have, in many instances, grown to maturity and when they reach this stage are more difficult to kill. Weeds are



more susceptible to chemical control measures during active growth periods and when carbohydrates [food manufacturing in leaves] are moving towards the root. This commonly occurs from Spring until flower opening and seed pod formation. After this time, chemical controls are less effective. Perennial weeds and grasses are susceptible again during Fall when the plant is moving more carbohydrates to the roots. This process carries the herbicide along with it.

First, identify the weed or grass type you want to control. Perhaps the most effective herbicide to use in the driveway or in pine straw is Round Up [glysophate], which

help with the task. The weeds comes in several strengths. The most economical version to use is the one with the highest concentration of glysophate. Mixing it with the proper amount of

> water will give the correct dilution percentage for effective recommended control. Use Round Up only on grasses and

weeds you want to kill because it is a contact-kill herbicide. Keep it off plants to be saved. Don't use Round Up underneath shallowrooted shrubs, trees, or other

Broadleaf weed and woody plants can be controlled with various formulations of 2,4-D, Mcpp, DiCambe, Trimec, or other phenoxy type herbicides. Here again, do not use phenoxys underneath shallow-rooted shrubs, trees, or plants to be saved.

Two other products to be used for grasses - such as Bermuda and crab grasses - are Vantage and Poast. They can be applied post-emergence. Vantage comes

ready to use. Just mix the recommended amount with water and spray. Poast must be mixed equally with a highly refined grade of horticultural oil at the recommended rate, add water, and

All of the mentioned pest control chemicals can be obtained from Cardinal Chemical Company in Aberdeen or may be available from other garden cen-

Other June gardening suggestions:

Pick spent blooms off daylilies and other flowering plants taking care not to disturb buds yet to

Stay after those dandelions and other troublesome weeds in the lawn. Control them by digging

them out or with spraying of the previously mentioned herbicides.

Pay close attention and harvest vegetables from your garden at their peak.

Check your vegetable garden, shrubs, trees, flowerbeds, and lawns for insect damage. If infestations warrant control them with a recommended safe control insecticide.

Keep lawn mower blades sharp and properly adjusted. It will make your lawn look better.

Suggested June vegetable garden plantings

In June you can plant are all types and variations of snap, bush, and pole beans, including limas, Southern field, crowder, or cowpeas. Also late tomato plants can be planted.



League briefed on juvenile justice efforts

At a recent luncheon meeting of the League of Women Voters of Moore County, Maureen Kruger, Moore County DA and Janet Currie, of Communities in Schools and formerly the Southern Pines Police Department both spoke on the topic, "Juvenile Justice in Moore County."

Kruger reported that over 1700 children in North Carolina were removed from their homes due to DSS or juvenile justice matters. DSS deals with minors, ages 7 through 16, who have committed a crime (called an act) or are a discipline problem. North Carolina is one of only three states that use the age of 16 as the beginning of adult crimes. Children under the age of seven are considered not capable of committing crimes.

Last year, there were 450 court filings against minors; such as by

a parent, a private citizen or a police officer. By statute, the focus in juvenile justice is rehabilitation and how to best treat the child. Complaints against juveniles go through an intake office; where as adults go to the magistrate. The intake officer may do one of several things; dismiss the case, counsel the child, make a contract for services (termed diversion) or approve the complaint for filing.

If the case is filed, it becomes like a civil case, with a summons and the burden of proof, etc. The child and his guardian must be summoned; if the guardian cannot be found, the court appoints one. Once the case goes to court, the youth must have an attorney, usually a court appointed one. Every thing is 'on the record' in Juvenile Court; a digital recorder is running the entire time. The Court

Report covers the youth's home life and DSS records; determines if the child is at risk and needs assessment and points out risks of recidivism and the details the plan of rehabilitation for the young person.

In the year 2000, a change in the juvenile laws made it harder to send children to training schools, however those sentenced receive longer term treatments, at least six months, up to the child's 18th or 19th birthday. Moore County seems to have fewer service options than other counties. Krueger stated that there is a new parenting class through Moore Youth Services. However, according to Krueger, 60 to 70% parents have a substance abuse or mental health

Krueger also gave her personal observations on intergenerational criminality; she observed a trend of no fathers in the home, or a parent in prison. She felt that success in the Juvenile programs was very hard, as the system cannot 'make good parents'. She also pointed out that the money allotted Moore County Juvenile System, by the County Commissioners, is the same as it was 10 years ago.

Janet Currie continued with

her personal observations of the juvenile court cases, when she worked as a Juvenile Defender. There was a box on the necessary form, under parental care, 'code 04', indicating no father in the home. She said 90% of the cases she processed fit that description. She quoted from the book, *Fatherless America*, how sex abuse, violence and fatherlessness are all causes of poverty.

Ms. Currie gave suggestions how the audience can help the

situation. She suggested supporting or creating groups that support both mothers and fathers. She commented that TANF (DSS cash assistance to families) supports only single parents with children. Even if there is a divorce, the father should remain active in the child's life.

Successful programs are Moore Buddies and the dropout prevention program from Communities in Schools (called SOS) and the CIS after school programs.



First Bancorp announced on Saturday, June 19 that First Bank, has entered into a purchase and assumption agreement with the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC), as receiver for Cooperative Bank, Wilmington, North Carolina.

The North Carolina Commissioner of Banks issued an order providing for the closing of Cooperative Bank and

appointed the FDIC as receiver.

First Bank will acquire all deposits and substantially all of the assets of Cooperative Bank and its subsidiary, Lumina Mortgage. All deposits are being assumed by First Bank with no losses to any depositor.

Cooperative Bank operated through twenty-one branches in North Carolina and three branches in South Carolina.

al Weather Service.

Everyone is invited to see how local ham radio operators quickly set up communication networks when other systems fail or are overloaded.





Big fun, big fish in Florida







Sunburned, bug bit? Here's what to do . . .

Minor cuts and scrapes are a part of everyday life every summer. For some people, the inconvenience and expense of seeking medical care may outweigh health concerns about the injury itself.

"It isn't always easy for the average person to judge the

severity of a bite, minor burn or cut, so people tend to wait to seek treatment," says David Strom. M.D., medical director of the Wound Care & Hyperbaric Center at FirstHealth Moore Regional Hospital. "Minor scrapes can be treated with supplies from a well-stocked first aid kit,

but major injuries or infections should be seen by a health care professional before they have time to become something more severe."

Dr. Strom and the staff of the Wound Care & Hyperbaric Center offer the following guidance on when to seek medical treat-

Sunburns can be treated with over-the-counter remedies, yet can be associated with shock, heat exhaustion and dehydration, which need professional attention. Symptoms of a serious sunburn can include severe painful blisters, nausea, fever, chills, extreme thirst, rapid breathing, faintness and dizziness.

Deep puncture wounds made by nails and knives are especially susceptible to the tetanus bacteria commonly found in soil. All wounds should be cleaned immediately. Adults who have not had a tetanus-diphtheria shot in 10 years or children who have not been vaccinated should seek professional attention and receive the vaccine.

People with certain medical conditions, such as diabetes and vascular disease, as well as the elderly and those who have had radiation therapy, should closely monitor all wounds for signs of infection or failure to heal, especially those on the lower limbs.

Seek medical treatment if a burn or wound shows signs of infection including increased pain at the wound site, redness or swelling spreading away from the wound, a foul wound odor, change in color or amount of drainage from the wound, or if you experience fever, chills, nausea or vomiting.

Bites from unknown or wild animals require immediate medical attention. Also seek treatment if the bite is deep or large, on the face, neck or hands, or if there is swelling, redness, pain or infection draining from the wound. Animal bites also pose a tetanus threat to those who have not been vaccinated.

Seek emergency assistance for insect bites if you experience trouble breathing, facial swelling or turning blue, weakness or tightening of the throat. Emergency rooms and wound healing centers equipped with hyperbaric oxygen chambers are needed to treat some serious spider bites such as those of the brown recluse spider.



ford's report, the Association may need to borrow approximately \$430,000 to complete the paving project.

A combined working subcommittee made up of members of the Finance and Maintenance Committee also discussed whether the paving work should include bringing community roads up to North Carolina Department of Transportation standards. Galford said the committee concluded that any tax or financial assistance benefits were limited and would require removing the gates.

A detailed copy of the paving project report is available online at the SLLA website.

Finance

Community Manager Dalton Fulcher reported a seven percent decrease in projected May income, explaining that dues collections were down because more residents were choosing to make payments [versus paying in full] than in the past, because the first \$50 collected is directed towards the restricted paving account, and because the month ended on a weekend.

Fulcher reported expenses are right on target at 8.54 percent.

Security

During public comment, a resident said that, on Memorial Day, he witnessed a boat with outdated stickers enter the community and launch at Sequoia

"What are you doing about boat patrol for the Fourth [of July]?" he asked.

Fulcher reported Boat Patrol will be on duty from 10:00 am to 8:00 pm for the next two weeks - the week before and after the holiday.

However, the discussion clearly hit a nerve with President Randy Zielsdorf.

"We've never gotten this gate thing right. We're spending \$250,000 between gates and patrol — a lot of money, but we're not getting proper allocation of resources," he charged. "This seems to be a problem and we don't have a solution. It's an awful lot of money and we are not getting a good bang for our buck."

Fulcher said one major problem was massive employee turnover within the contract company, SFI. "We have new guards at the one of the gates every week."

Recreation

The new modular equipment

for the Northside playground has been delivered, reported Director Bruce Keyser, Jr. But construction will be delayed until mid-July to accommodate maintenance staff vacation schedules, with completion and installation anticipated in early August.

Northsider Ron Erskine expressed concern, during Public Comment, that lake water was only tested once a year. He informed the Board that he had formed a lakeside residents association with a primary objective to monitor water quality of all community lakes.

Using the Coliphate [CP] method, a procedure developed in Canada and already adopted by many communities, Erskine said water quality could be tested more accurately and less expensively than the current method.

"These tests are more reliable and species specific for E.coli — and E.coli is what we really want to test for," he said.

Director Sally Kindsvatter, a microbiologist, said she would like to review the testing materials and compare them to the current methods used.

"You have to be careful and need to have controls. You can get false positive results and we don't want to scare the community," said Kindsvatter.

Erskine responded that the tests were guaranteed and that the Association owes it to those (See "SLLA," p. 22)

(Continued from page 21) using the beaches to test more frequently.

"We should be doing more," he charged.

Also during Public Comment, the Board resumed discussion on a request by lakefront landowner Rich Scott to relocate buoys further away from his dock.

During the June Work Session, the Board agreed the 150foot rule for buoy placement was adequate; however, Keyser recommended the Board reconsider.

"Where the buoys are now creates a sharp turn that forces a massive wake towards his [Scott's] dock," Keyser reported.

After discussion of several placement options, the Board agreed to relocate the problem buoys back to their original locations.

Community Standards, ARB & Beautification

The Architectural Review Board approved several remodeling projects, Director Kindsvatter reported, including three deck additions, a new roof, a screened porch conversion, lot clearing, and a driveway extension pending location of the septic field.

Kindsvatter thanked the members of the Beautification Committee for their work maintaining flowerbeds at the Northside Mail House.

President Zielsdorf also encouraged residents to continue to use trash receptacles located in common areas to reduce litter.

Seven Community Standards items are unresolved, reported Assistant Community Manager Chad Beane, with five complaints scheduled for hearing by the Judicial Committee on July 2.

Director Kent Droppers reported several new members joined the Community Standards Committee and said the 'call first' policy for complaints seemed to working well.

"Unfortunately a majority of items are chronic or repeat offenders and absentee owners," Dropper said.

In related discussion, Fulcher said time spent mowing roadside shoulders had not been reduced by the recent Board action to limit mowing to specific areas.

"It takes just as long to mow

here and there, than to mow the whole thing. It's not saving time or money," Fulcher said, explaining his decision to instruct maintenance to resume full roadside mowing.

Community Manager Search

Interviews with representatives from four management companies will be held beginning in early July, reported Droppers, to be followed by interviews with individuals interested in the Community Manager position.

Kindsvatter requested that Fulcher and Beane pull their files and management materials together to provide a comprehensive operations or procedures manual.

Galford reported that an initial discussion on system of governance, detailing the future role of the Board of Directors, would be held in July. He anticipated a draft outline would be complete in October and formalized in November.

"Looking at the role and responsibilities of property own-

ers, the Board, of committees, and the manager — the one role that comes into play most frequently is the responsibility of owners to work with the Board and not against it," Galford said.

Other items

The Community Plan, a tenyear long range plan initiated by President Zielsdorf last year and drafted by Ray Pardue, will be presented for discussion in July and August. "The Community Plan is not set in stone and will concentrate on years one to five," Zielsdorf said.

Speed bumps were installed in the guest lane at the Northside gates, reported Community Manager Fulcher. And some barcode stickers at the Southside gates are not reading correctly. If you have difficulty, have the guard record your sticker number.

Directors Bud Shaver and Gary Caulk were unable to attend the meeting.

or replaced; and some have suggested moving the front gate guardhouse back to that position.

In addressing any and all of these questions, a key concern is making sure that the appearance of entrance to Seven Lakes West helps enhance the property values of landowners.

Goodman explained that LRP had recommended hiring an outside consulting firm, Land-Design, to develop a master plan for both the front a back gate areas. After hearing a presentation on the concept, the Board "conceptually approved" the idea and asked Goodman to

head up a committee to outline the work and negotiate a contract with the vendor. He said the planning process will likely cost less than \$15,000.

The Board created a second committee to look at property ownership and possible acquisitions near the front and back gate. Noting that there may one day be a need for a guardhouse at the back gate, Goodman said there may be other opportunities in that area, though he did not provide any detail about what those might be.

Finally, a third committee, consisting of Goodman, Legal Director Ed Silberhorn, and President Ron Shepard are working with the owners of the Parkwood neighborhood near the front gate to think through issues raised by the fact that some of Parkwoods lots would access Lakeway Drive between the current mailhouse and the gate house.

"We're trying to get a longrange vision of what we want," Goodman said. "When we get a little more in place, we will be able to provide more specifics to the membership.'

"I know some people are for a guard station at the back gate and some think that is ridiculous," he added. "Right now we are just studying it."

Septic Management Plan could become mandatory

Legal Director Ed Silberhorn said the July edition of the Seven Lakes West Newsletter will carry a proposal for a rules change that would make the currently voluntary septic management program mandatory for all homeowners whose property drains into Lake Auman. The process of evaluating the rules change will begin during the Board's July 14 Work Session. He thanked Bob Fewkes, George Jenner,

Bud Sales, and Jay Mikula for the work they had put into developing the proposal over the past vear.

Silberhorn reported that the annexation of the Parkwood neighborhood into the Association continues to move forward, with the resolution of some paving and drainage issues. A final annexation agreement has been forwarded to the attorney representing Parkwood's developer, he noted.

The Stonegate neighborhood near the back gate was given a

County reviews Stonegate

Moore County's Subdivision Review Board [SRB] took its first look at the Stonegate Subdivision proposed for an area just inside the back gate of Seven Lakes West in a Tuesday, June 23 meeting.

The "conceptual review" produced no objections to developer Ron Myers' plan for twelve patio homes on the 13.5 acre property on Gateway Drive. The 2000square-foot, three bedroom, three bath, single level homes will be tightly clustered along a single street and cul-de-sac, leaving more than fifty percent of the acreage in open space.

Myers presented the concept to a general meeting of the Seven Lakes West Landowners Association last year and has negotiated an annexation agreement that will bring Stonegate residents into the Association.

The space left open in Stonegate will either be deeded to the Association, protected by covenants, or both, he told the SRB. Each unit will have its own septic system; water will be provided through an existing county water line under Gateway Drive.

Planner Tim Garner told the panel that the development appears to meet all applicable county standards.


The SRB is a panel comprised primarily of individuals with expertise in specific areas related to development, including

representatives of county, planning, inspections, health, and public works departments, Moore County Schools, and the NC Department of Transportation.

The next step in the county's approval process will require Myers to develop a preliminary

plat that will be presented to the SRB for approval. Once that is approved, development of the property can begin.

No timeframe for plat submission or development was discussed during Tuesday's meeting.

Exercise care around wildlife

Association.

Security Director John Hoffman said Summer weather had brought with it a number of wildlife sightings by Westsiders, including grey and red foxes and coyotes. He shared advice from County Wildlife Control Officer Paul Tillman, warning residents to not feed, approach, or corner wildlife. For example, if you leave your garage door up and find a fox inside, Hoffmann said, the proper response is to call Animal Control — not to try to deal with the animal yourself.

Hoffmann noted that many species have recently borne young and new mothers can be especially testy if approached.

Safety & Security

Hoffman said a number of emails have been circulating in the community expressing concern about residents on the Beacon Ridge side of Lake Auman being "trapped" with no exit in the case of a major storm creating tree falls on Longleaf. "We have no less than three other back exits [that could be used in such an emergency]," Hoffmann said, "though their locations are not

the community would be served by its own Community Emergency Response Team [CERT] as well as county rescue organizations. Hoffmann said he hoped to get more information out to the community on the issue of emergency preparedness and response.

Noting that boating and swimming season are in full swing, Hoffmann reminded swimmers that they are to stay within 75 feet of shore when swimming in Lake Auman, and boaters that they are not to approach any closer than 75 feet of shore. The recent lack of rain is creating "tinder dry" conditions, he said, encouraging those using fire pits and grills to be especially vigilant in tending the flames.

A speed bump has been installed on the inside of the entry lane at the back gate, Hoffman said, with the objective of slowing down entering traffic to prevent tailgating and to allow security cameras a clear shot of license plates. Sheriff's officers have been conducting traffic enforcement inside the gates and have written a number of speeding tickets, he added.

Infrastructure

Director Goodman reported that re-striping of Longleaf Drive was scheduled to begin on Thursday, June 25, and that the construction of two boundary fences one along Banbridge Drive and the other back of West Side Park — would begin during the first week of July.

Goodman said he and other Board representatives have met with residents of Butterfly Court to offer a possible solution to persistent drainage problems on that street. "The residents are mulling it over," he added.

Goodman said he would be hosting a meeting to begin to work on the problem of getting more fire hydrants installed in Seven Lakes West.

Architectural Review

Director Adam Wimberly said the number one complaint being fielded by the Architectural Review Committee concerns unsightly satellite dishes. As a result, "The front gate has been notified to not let installers come in unless the installation has been approved by ARC," Wimberley said, noting that the point

was not to prevent the installation of dishes, but to insure that ARC is involved in decisions about placement.

Wimberley asked residents to use the yard waste disposal site to dispose of grass clippings rather than depositing them on vacant lots or common areas. He noted that the debris site is onpen Saturdays from 1:00 pm to 5:00 pm. That prompted resident Jamie Eilert to ask how folks who work during those hours are supposed to use the site. Director Goodman promised that the Board would look at that issue during its next Work Session

(Continued from front page) its symbols, whereas those allied as Bloods are related to the People Nation.

All gangs use colored clothing and bandannas, symbols, hand signs, and other identifying markers specific to their nation. They will also use common sports teams and company logos as their own, assigning them value with codes and allegiances using

acronyms or numbers in a specific order.

Unlike California, gangs in North Carolina do not discriminate membership based on race, gender, or economic status.

"Here they mingle more. Black and white, how rich or poor, it doesn't matter," said Flint.

However, identifying gang members is not as easy as one might think, Flint explained.

"Just because someone is wearing a bandanna or sagging pants doesn't mean they are a gang member."

Instead unusual jewelry, use of symbols or elaborate handshakes, wearing same colors or a specific sports team jersey most of the time, and tattoos especially teardrops, are red flags. Gang graffiti can be identified through use of numbers, crossed out letters, and other intentional symbols.

When asked by The Times about whether the nuisance graffiti seen recently in Seven Lakes should be of concern, Kimbrell responded, "A wanna-be is a gonna-be! If a child is engaging in graffiti and tagging, they are already beginning to behave like a gang member."

According to the Task Force, the best gang prevention is awareness. "Be nosey. Ask questions about who your child and grandchild is hanging out with," said Flint. "If you see strange graffiti or a group of people dressed alike and showing hand signs, report it and we'll check it

ard assured Eilert that the Board was studying the proposal to man the back gate but had made no decision on the issue. He said any such decision would be undertaken only after significant opportunity for community input.

- Betty Milligan asked what was being done to stop unauthorized access to the community through dirt roads and trails. In addition to the new fencing that will soon be erected. Director Hoffman said, resident Chuck Spellman has joined the Security Committee as its expert on perimeter security and will be developing plans for securing and monitoring the community's borders.

Other items

Also during the Tuesday, June 23, SLWLA meeting:

- President Sheaprd announced that ten students had successfully completed the Sailing Club's Annual sailing school.

- Directed the county staff to prepare an application to USDA Rural Development for a grant of up to \$90,000 which will fund a program running in tandem with the Scattered Site Housing Program.
- Held a public hearing on and approved a conditional use zoning permit for former Commissioner David Cummings that will allow him to convert four chicken houses to "Mini-Warehouse/Storage Facilities."


