Sequoia Dam may have a clogged French drain

A clogged French drain may be to blame for a piezometer test hole that overflowed with water during a recent test at Sequoia Dam.

"This is not good news," Com-

Three NC firms in the running to manage SLLA

Information -- without detailed proposals for staffing or costs - from the three management companies under consideration by the Seven Lakes Landowners Association [SLLA] Board of Directors was made available for public review at the office on Monday, September 22.

The three companies are Asheville-based IPM, Talis Management Group of Raleigh, and Community Association Services, Inc., which currently provides community management services to the Seven Lakes West Landowners Association and has its headquarters in Pinehurst.

Director Kent Droppers reported in August that the Board had a clear favorite among the companies based on their initial presentations. However, for a fair cost comparison, each company will also be asked to submit a second proposal with equal staffing levels.

Using a two-pronged approach to the decision on new management, the Board will also be interviewing several hand-picked individual candidates for the position -- including Assistant Community Manager Chad Beane

Speaking to *The Times* on Tuesday, President Randy Zielsdorf said the Board was wrapping up the first stage of the search: interviewing management companies.

"We are in the process of asking questions to get clarifications on the initial proposals. Then we are looking forward to starting the second round of the search through interviews with

Neighborhood Watch is underway on West Side

The West Side's Neighborhood Watch program is underway, with a crew of twenty-eight volunteers trained and authorized to use the red Seven Lakes West Landowners Association [SLWLA] pickup truck to patrol the neighborhood, on the lookout for suspicious activity.

Safety and Security Director John Hoffmann reported during the Association's Tuesday, September 22, General Meeting that the patrols had been in effect for about two weeks. "We are spreading ourselves out across the spectrum of the clock," Hoffmann said, "because we want you to see that truck in daylight hours, too. We want you to see us at the front gate, at the back gate . . . we want you to see us at Johnson Point on the weekends . . . so that you get a better sense that somebody is out there trying to deter people who may have our homes, our property, as targets."

The volunteers involved in the patrols are strictly observers, who report any suspicious activity noted to the Sheriff's Office,

which was involved in helping establish the program. Volunteers are not allowed to leave the truck while on patrol, let alone interfere with or attempt to apprehend those they suspect of engaging in criminal activity.

Liability concerns raised

Despite those safeguards, retired Whispering Pines Police Chief Louis Gregory, who lives in Seven Lakes West, raised concerns about the danger in which the program places patrol members and the potential lia-

No doubt that was on the minds of the judges who in July crowned Davidson Junior Miss North Carolina State Tarheel. [See photo on front page.]







Stimulus funds help schools weather state cuts

Moore County Schools [MCS] faced a shortfall of \$6.9 million in its funding from the state of North Carolina this year, but with the aid of federal stimulus dollars and a little borrowing from the fund balance, they were able to moderate the impact of state funding cuts on the classroom.

That was the message that Moore County Schools Superintendent Dr. Susan Purser and Finance Officer Michael Griffith carried to the Moore County Board of Commissioners during their Monday, September 21 meeting.

"Last year at this time, began to work on figuring out how to save money," Purser told the Board. "We trimmed positions throughout the year when vacancies occurred. We realigned, reassigned, re-did everything that could be re-done."

Purser said she had the diffi-

cult task, at the end of the school year, of meeting with ninety employees to let them know they would not have a job with MCS in the coming school year. Making matters, worse, they could not be sure of funding from Raleigh until two weeks before school started.

In the end, Purser said, they were able to save 35 teaching positions.

"Even though we suffered severe reductions and millions of dollars in cuts," Purser added, "we looked after our fund balance. I hovered over that like a hen with brand new egg. We guarded it carefully, and we fed it carefully throughout the year. . . In the end we were able to tap that fund balance to put back in place some critical functions."

The fund balance is the unspent money the MCS — or the county, for that matter has left over at the end of the year. It can function something like a savings account for pub-

Griffin explained that state funding for MCS was cut from \$64.8 million in 2008-2009 to \$57.9 million this year. The largest single cut was \$3.3 million in funding for non-instructional personnel: janitors, cafeteria workers, maintenance, etc. Ultimately, federal stimulus dollars replaced all but \$100,000 of that cut.

The state also cut \$1.7 million in various state-mandated spending - for things like central office expenditures, textbooks, staff development, and atrisk students.

Another \$1.9 million in local discretionary funding was cut by the state. "It was our decision what to do about those cuts," Griffin said. "Our focus was to save teaching positions."

The county held its funding for schools even with last year, at \$24.9 million.

Griffin explained that MCS pulled \$1.8 million from its fund balance to restore some of the

areas cut by the state, including information technology for classrooms, staff development at schools, a FirstStep program with Sandhills Community College, and some critical maintenance projects.

The budget included no raises in personnel salaries, though it did include an increase in contributions to the employee retirement fund and a nine percent increase in the cost of employee health insurance - both increases mandated by the state.

"We really appreciate the support from the Commissioners,"

Purser said in conclusion. "Next year doesn't promise to be any better. We've already been notified that we will lose another million dollars in state funding."

"All of the federal money is two-year money," she noted. "We have invested that heavily in people, which is the right decision to make when you are dealing with educating children."



Mason Gould muses on 90 years with words

Trying to pin down that definable moment when his life's passion began, Mason Gould looked to grade school.

"My kindergarten teacher said something about my writing. I don't remember exactly what it was - but it was good. So I decided to make a living at it," he reminisced.

A job writing for the school

newspaper led to an early career in journalism and then military service during World War II as an interpreter.

"Once they found out I had a language background with five years of French, they thought I could learn Italian too," Gould said of his years stationed first in North Africa then back in the states working with prisoners of war.

A lifelong athlete, Gould was

a star pitcher at the University of Michigan and a member of the top four pitching staff when they won the Big Ten championship during his senior year.

"Being my size I had to resort to throwing what I call junk," Gould said. "Obviously I can't throw a 100 mph fast ball, so I'd throw a curve ball and then a change-up and then throw something at the batter's head!"

Tennis was another great passion, and Gould said that quitting because of health concerns was one of the hardest decisions he ever made

He made his professional home in the Hartford, Connecticut area in the field of public relations. Working for firms both big and small, Gould oversaw several divisions, retiring as president of Reynolds/Gould.

Together with his wife, Gould moved to Seven Lakes North in the late 1980's. After losing Janet to the ravages of Alzheimer's disease, Gould again sought out writing as a creative outlet.

"I express myself through words. As a writer you learn about people and then have the ability to spread that knowledge out a bit," said Gould.

In addition to writing freelance feature articles and Mason's

Musings, a regular column for The Times, he is an active member of the North Carolina Writer's Network and The Sandhills-Seven Lakes Writer's Group.

"We meet once a month or so to critique each others literary efforts - very politely," Gould joked.

"I so much enjoy when people say that just a few little sentences that I wrote perked them up," he said. "I've seen so much, I just want to relay a few thoughts I have in the hope that someone will be perked up. Then I feel pretty good."





St. Mary Magadalene completes remodel

A major interior renovation last year of St. Mary Magdalene Episcopal Church is simply the most recent sign of growth and progress for this small mission.

"When I first visited, I was immediately struck by how warm and welcoming this church is to newcomers," said Vestry member Mercedes Herdrich. "We were trying to mirror that spirit of warmth and welcome in our facilities."

Founded in Troy in 1980 by Dr. William and Bette Hanham of Seven Lakes North, the church later relocated to Seven Lakes Drive, occupying the brick building that formerly housed the Seven Lakes Baptist Church.

Now awash with cream-colored walls and warm wood tones, the renovation created a calm space for worship with seating for one hundred. The kitchen was also updated and the renovation extended to include a library, and organized space for offices, the choir, and the children's Sunday School program.

The church's focal point - the altar - is complimented with recessed lighting and a handcrafted wood cross and one-ofa-kind Paschal candle stand both designed and created by local builder Chad Stites, in memory of his father.

The church also houses The Gallery at Seven Lakes, an art space for local photographers and artists, and meeting rooms for various community businesses and organizations including a weekly donation of space and equipment to the Moore County Literacy Council.

St. Mary Magdalene Episcopal Church is a member of the worldwide Anglican Communion, a Christian body which is both Catholic and Reformed.

"Catholic in that it prizes and enjoys an unbroken continuity of Christian life and witness within the framework of an Episcopal, sacramental church; and Reformed in that it is heir to the liberating insights of the Refor-

mation," explained the Rev. Bob Brown

Father Bob, as he is called, is one of two priests that serve the church on an alternating schedule.

"Both Father Fred and Father Bob are very good. They are both very different in the way they preach - but it's nice to have a variety of styles," Herdrich

Brown explained that Anglicanism - and the Episcopal Church - hold a tradition with a distinctive interpretation of the old faith.

"We delight in Scripture as a life-giving resource and as the only authority essential for Christian doctrines," he said. "We are uneasy with the idea of Biblical inerrancy. Scripture is holy but must be wrestled with. We approach the Bible with reverence, affection, and caution."

The Episcopal Church follows the 'Great Commission,' that is to

go forth into the world, baptizing and spreading the teachings of Christ. St. Mary Magdalene hopes to outgrow their current facility and buy land to build a new, larger church and obtain parish status by 2013.

"We are trying to grow our church because that is what Jesus wants us to do," said Brown

Each Sunday the morning worship service is held at 9:30 am followed by a coffee hour. A scheduled Coffee & Contemplation program offers a more indepth study of the Scriptures, and many of the members also share fellowship through a monthly Supper Club.

Sometimes called "The Raisin Church," St. Mary Magdalene members collect and deliver boxes of raisins for the Backpack Pals program, as well as weekly donations to the Sandhills/Moore Coalition for Human Care, the Episcopal Thrift Shop in Southern Pines, and the Sandhills Animal Rescue League. Other outreach activities include a healing prayer group, prayer shawl knitters, and the handy man "A Team," among others.

In addition the church actively supports their missionaries in Tanzania, Africa, the internationally known artist Jessie Stuart Mackay and the Rev. Tally Bandy.

"We believe that Christianity is caught not taught," said Brown. "There is room for all in our church."

- Held a public hearing on and approved minor changes to the Zoning Ordinance which Planning Director Joey Raczkowski explained were "simply to correct some language or duplications. There are no regulation changes in this list," he added.
- Held a public hearing on and approved a request from the Planning Staff to rezone a 32 acre Eagle Springs parcel from Rural Agricultural to Light Industrial. The land, near the intersection of Flowers Road and NC Highway 211, is the site of the TH Blue mulch business, which has operated in that location since 1976. Raczkowski explained that, when countywide zoning was implemented, the maps created "got the shape of the parcel wrong."
- · Deferred a public hearing and decision on another proposed rezoning — a 95 acre parcel in the eastern portion of the county that would be rezoned from Rural Agricultural - 40 to a Rural Agricultural - Conditional Use District to allow it to accommodate a business that would train bomb-sniffing dogs for the military. Raczkowski explained that the Planning Board had met for more than three hours earlier in the day to consider the request, heard form a number of residents of the area around the parcel, and generated more questions than answers. He explained that the Planning Board would take up the request again in its Thursday, October 8 meeting. The Commissioners will reconsider it during their October 15 meet-

- Monday, October 5 on a Partners in Progress request that the county provide a \$15,000 incentive to assist the Eaton Corporation in relocating their headquarters to Moore County.

installed at the top and bottom of the dam face. The problem area is located on the lower, western portion.

"We wanted water in the pipe — but further down," Fulcher explained. "When we took the cap off, we had an artesian well."

The French Drain on the eastern side of the dam was replaced in 1986, Fulcher said, but the drain on the wsetern end of the dam was not included in that repair. According to Fulcher's report, the Western drain is not functioning properly. He said the Association's dam engineer, S&ME, would prepare a report for the State and warned the Board that a mandate was possible

"I don't know what the State will require or what the engineers will recommend to the State but it will be based on how the upper pipe tests," Fulcher said.

New Management Search

Despite a fairly large crowd, few landowners offered input on the SLLA management search during a public comment period set aside for that purpose.

Director Kent Droppers reported that he has received detailed proposals from the three management companies under consideration — CAS of Pinehurst, Raleigh-based Talis Management, and IPM of Asheville — and that he would prepare a spreadsheet comparing them for the Board next week.

In addition, interviews have been scheduled with two of the three individual candidates under consideration — including Assistant Community Manager Chad Beane.

During public comment, Northsider Jordan Rhodes railed against the Board's resistance to holding a vote of property owners on the decision about future management. "I feel the community manager [position] is a huge job in this facility. You had no problem with asking members to vote on a dues increase," he stated. "I also read a comment that not enough turn out to vote — only thirty percent: I find that lame. A thirty percent turnout is far in excess of what is sitting here. I don't understand the resistance to why Chad Beane could not be given a trial period or to allow a vote on management."

However, Helen Simpson, also of Seven Lakes North, countered that voting privileges carry responsibility.

"I don't see why landowners stay away from these meetings. Why should they have a right to vote if they don't participate," she argued.

Also during the comment period, Erik Wilderson said the front office staff had been extremely helpful and responsive and hoped their positions would be considered. Fellow Northsider Charlie Oliver commended Droppers and the Board for their efforts and for the management companies they have selected for consideration.

"I took time to read the brochures and was impressed with each," he said. "They are resident-oriented."

Road Repaving Project

At the September 14 Work Session, the Board unequivocally recommended moving forward with road repaving — on schedule — with work commencing in September 2010.

"The Board was unanimous in stating that we need this community to present the best image it can," Treasurer Denny Galford said. "We want to make it clear that the overall appearance of this community will be enhanced."

He reported that the Road Repaving Subcommittee will (See "SLLA," p. 20)

determine in October what major repair projects should be prioritized and when paving of the twelve miles of primary roads is recommended.

Specifically, Galford identified as priorities repairs along areas of Dogwood, Lancashire, Cardinal, Edgewood, Devonshire, Hastings roads, as well as a portion of Echo Dam, and curbing at the main Northside common parking lot.

Road crack sealing will commence in January and February 2010. Galford explained that crack sealing is much more effective during the cold, Winter months.

Security

Director Gary Caulk presented a numbers-laden report on security activity over the past two months.

Over 9,000 vehicles passed through the North and South gates in August; however, September saw a fifty percent reduction in traffic. Currently there are 3,124 active barcode stickers.

Roving Patrol daily activity logs indicate frequent, scheduled checks of both unoccupied residences and common area facilities, including the yard debris site, maintenance shed, boat storage area, mail rooms, offices and North Clubhouse, and Sequoia Point.

In addition, Roving Patrol responded to nearly eighty dispatched calls and as many violations, including five vehicles stopped for excessive speed. In August, twenty one groups were unable to present guest passes upon request and were asked to leave, while only one such violation was reported in September.

"Things are moving along pretty well," Caulk said.

Maintenance

A comparison report of inhouse versus out-sourced maintenance costs was prepared by Bob Darr and presented to the Board in a Closed Session on September 14, reported Director Bud Shaver.

The Maintenance Committee has reviewed the report and is also now compiling and categorizing all additional projects.

"Maintenance does a lot of other stuff that most don't even

know about. I have a list of fiftyseven items just from September ... from installing a ditch to picking up a dead goose," said Shaver.

In addition, the committee inspected the boat storage and identified eleven unregistered boat trailers.

"If you haven't checked [your boat or trailer], you better go on out there," recommended Shaver. "It may have been relocated."

Recreation

With a record-setting enrollment of 104 students, the Seven Lakes Dance youth program is off to a great new season, reported Director Bruce Keyser, Jr.

Other recreation programs underway this Fall include adult aerobics on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday mornings, a trip to the NC State Fair on October 20, the children's Halloween Carnival on Saturday, October 31, and an outlet shopping trip to Smithfield.

Assistant Manager Beane said both pool and day camp activities had gone very well and thanked everyone for a good and safe Summer season.

Community Standards

With major road paving on the horizon, Director Droppers encouraged residents to take a look at their home's roof.

"Road and roofs are the big things that date a community," he said.

Notable community standards violations reported include boats parked at residences. Beane reminded residents that boats should be strategically placed in an unobtrusive location near the home.

Twenty-one unkempt properties were reported in September, and six of thirty-three August

violations are still unresolved.

"We encourage everyone to take pride in their property," Beane said.

Another concern is the number of homes that can not be readily identified, especially at night or during an emergency. Beane recommended purchasing a reflective address sign which can be obtained through a new fundraising initiative of the Seven Lakes EMS. A sample sign and order forms are available at the office.

Shaver reminded residents that an emergency blinking light (See "SLLA," p. 21)

is also available for purchase through the Seven Lakes EMS squad.

Finance

The annual CPA audit and report is complete and available for review at the office, Treasurer Galford reported. In October, the Finance Committee will begin reviewing the proposed budget.

Galford also commended the Recreation Committee for their selection of playground equipment recently installed at Northside Park.

"It is a fine-looking piece and seems to be very well-used," he

The Finance Committee also drafted a System of Governance organizational chart which was distributed to the Board for discussion at the October 12 Work Session.

Manager's Report

Community Manager Fulcher reported revenue from dues was running below expectations with ninety percent collected.

"It should be higher, but I know there are problems out there. We have a lot more people on payment plans," he said.

Total general income stands at eighty-five percent and capital expenses were reported to be on target at forty-two percent, with pool expenses notably under budget at 81 percent.

Kevin Tanner, Owner

Fulcher said e.Coli tests conducted at swimming areas before Labor Day had reported good results. Closing out the Summer season, eight additional test samples were collected on September 30.

Concluding his report, Fulcher addressed frequent criticism of himself and SLLA staff.

"A lot has been said over the last three years . . . on how bad the Association has been operated, but I believe the appearance of Seven Lakes compared to eight years ago is just the opposite."

Fulcher detailed many significant projects and improvements including new signs, lighting, barcode system, and remodeled gate houses at the entrances; new restrooms, general landscaping, and playground at Sequoia Point; new fencing, surfacing, and kiddle pool improvements on the North Side; in addition to mail house projects, tennis court resurfacing, and upgrades to the primary community playground.

"The Boards have spent a lot of money and the staff has done a lot of work to improve Seven Lakes over the last eight years," Fulcher said, noting that there has been only one dues increase during that period — and that adjusted salary increases amount to only \$5,000 increase.

"I've heard a lot of comments that staff is not professional enough, but don't believe every-

thing you read or hear. The bottom line is that people should not be saying, 'What have you done lately?' but rather, 'I can't believe what you have done over the last eight years!""

Architectural Review Board

Director Sally Kindsvatter reported approval of one new house, four roofs, and one trellis. In addition, ARB granted a setback variance of less than twelve inches and listened to a proposal on SIPS, a new type of construction.

Don Fentzlaff was appointed to serve on ARB.

Other Business

In other business, the Board:

 Heard from Fulcher that a proposal was anticipated to close Cedar Lane — an undeveloped road in Seven Lakes North — to create one or two very large residential lots. The Association would need an easement to allow continued adequate access to Timber Dam.

- Approved a request by President Randy Zielsdorf for an additional \$50 towards startup and incorporation expenses for the Greater Seven Lakes Community Council.
- Approved a request to recombine lots 2366 and 2367 in Seven Lakes South.
- Heard from Northsider Bob Racine that the condition of the Sequoia Point boat dock was unsatisfactory.
- Heard from Northsider Elaine Wilderson that amplified noise levels at Sequoia Point were unacceptable. "I'm not sure what the rules are, and maybe security doesn't either," Wilderson said, noting that Roving

Patrol seemed unable or unwilling to intervene.

- Heard from a resident of Edgewater Drive that, despite repeated requests, Fulcher had not resolved his complaint that a clogged pipe installed by the Association was not allowing water to drain properly on his property. "I only get a song and a dance that they will look into this but I'm still waiting. I haven't gotten satisfaction," he said.
- Appointed Ken Keating and alternate member Bob Racine to the Judicial Committee.
- Appointed Director Bruce Keyser, Jr. to chair the Nominating Committee.

(Continued from front page) bility it represents for the Association.

"When you put twenty-eight people or anyone out there operating in a situation in which we are requesting that they look for and report criminal activity, they are going to place themselves and this Association in a situation that might possibly cause them to get hurt. They are not police officers, yet the people that they are going to be observing are involved in a criminal activity, and they are going to do whatever they possibly can to prevent themselves from being captured or arrested."

"I understand the concept of trying to get someone out here to look out for our interests, and I support that," Gregory said. But he said sending well-intentioned patrol volunteers out in an obvious, marked truck, to observe possible criminal behavior, was "asking for trouble."

"If one of these people is to get hurt, or if they are involved in something that causes someone else to get hurt, then where are we?"

"I've been in law enforcement for forty-three years," Gregory said. "I know what I am talking about ... We don't need people out here who have very little training in law enforcement, if any, that are riding in these trucks, that are doing these activities that we are sanctioning, that is going to create a real problem and a liability for our Association that could be up in the millions."

Both Hoffmann and Legal Affairs Director Ed Silberhorn attempted to assure Gregory that the patrols' scope of activity was limited, and that a combination of Association insurance and the personal insurance of patrol members should cover any liability concerns.

"We have insurance," Silber-

horn told Gregory. "We are supporting Mr. Hoffmann's plan, with regard to the Neighborhood Watch program, as long as they are in the scope of their authority within that program." Silberhorn noted that the patrol volunteers are not even allowed to leave the truck.

"We'll take care of hospital bills?" Gregory asked.

"No," Silberhorn responded.
"They are not employees of the community. They are volunteers. Their liability is protected under the [Association's] insurance. Their own hospitalization takes care of their own situation. Just like the CERT volunteers . . . We have a lot of these groups that are set up to help. They are all volunteers, this is a volunteer community." Silberhorn noted that CERT volunteers are "risking life and limb to help people" and are covered under "the

Good Samaritan statute."

"I do advocate Community Watch," Gregory said, apparently referring to the broader program of which volunteer patrols are only one part. "I have no problem with that. My problem is the people out in the trucks. I am concerned about them."

Noting that he and Gregory had discussed liability and safety concerns previously, Hoffmann addressed the cost of using sworn law officers, rather than volunteers, to patrol the community.

"We would like to see the Sheriff's department on duty in Seven Lakes West 24/7," Hoffmann said. "Constant presence. Why not two vehicles? Why not one at each gate? I'd like to guard the back gate 24/7. It will only be another \$110,000 per year. Do we want the Sheriff's

presence, and all their arrest authorities? Absolutely. Is that realistic?"

"There are positions we can take between what we have and 24/7 police protection and those are going to be discussed during the budget process. Security continues to be one of the highest priorities on the people in the community. The question will be, how much do we want to spend? What kind of protection do we want to buy?"

More Security initiatives

In addition to beginning Neighborhood Watch patrols, Hoffmann reported that the Safety and Security Committee has several other initiatives underway:

 A new Standard Operating Procedure for handling visitors at the gate. Hoffmann said that vendors unknown to the gate guards will receive

extra scrutiny before being admitted to the community. "We want to know why they are here," he explained, "and we're going to call you to ask to make sure that you have invited them to your house."

- Improved lighting and motion sensors at Johnson Point. "We have had vandalism there in the past," Hoffmann said. "We want to improve that situation down there."
- An emergency egress plan. Hoffmann said he was in the process of writing the plan, which would lay out procedures for utilizing emergency exits from the community in the case of an evactuation. "We will have some signage in the Community directing you to emergency exits if a evacuation is required," he added.

Hoffmann said he had been asked by the local fire departments and other first responders to encourage residents to

make the house numbers as visible as possible, so they can easily find the home when called to an emergency. He noted that all the fire and EMS vehicles and most Sheriff's vehicles have been issued barcodes that let them access the West Side with no delay.

Finally, Hoffmann reminded resident that the Association continues to encourage speed enforcement by Sheriff's deputies within the gates. "Slow down! The Sheriff is in town," he said.

AED's on order

President Ron Shepherd reported that an Automated External Defibrillator is on order and will be installed in the West Side Park Community Center. The device is designed to allow lay people, with some training in CPR, to rapidly assist an apparent victim of heart attack. Project HeartSmart, an initiative of FirstHealth and the local Chapter of the American Red Cross, has been promoting the installation of the devices in public locations all across the county.

Shepherd said the Westside's AED will be delivered in a couple of weeks, after which training sessions will be set up to prepare residents to use the device.

"I would encourage as many people as possible to take the class," Shepherd said.

Community Activities

Director Karen Milligan reported that the annual Halloween Trunk or Treat event would not be held this year, due to a lack of trunks. "There are tons of children, but not enough people volunteering to decorate their cars and hand out candy," Milligan said.

Instead, the Community Activities Committee will sponsor a "Spooktacular Family Movie Night," featuring the Disney film "Return to Witch Mountain," on October 26. Costumes will be encouraged and refreshments provided.

Planning for Christmas-related festivities is also well underway, Milligan said, with a day full of activities on December 6, including the traditional community tree-lighting. The committee also has plans to "reenergize" the holiday decorations at the gates, mail house, and West Side Park.

A wide range of classes are underway, ranging from shag dancing to oil painting, Tai Chi to Cooking with Carmela. A full schedule of classes and events is available under the Community Activities tab on the Association's website at www.sevenlakeswest.org.

After Milligan's completed her report, the landowners in attendance gave her and her committee a round of applause for a successful Margaritaville community party on Friday, September 18.

Public Comment

During the public comment portion of the meeting, one resident, noting a Times report about a proposed hiking trail in the vicinity of Morganwood, asked whether it would be designed to accommodate bikes

as well. President Shepherd said the design of Morganwood provided for a perimeter trail that "offers some nice hikes through the woods," but is currently not maintained. Shepherd said he thought the potential uses of the trail defined in the Morganwood covenants would include biking.

Gene Lentz asked for an update on the question of streetside mail delivery within Seven Lakes West. Shepherd said the Association had received yet another letter from the US Postal Service indicating that they would not provide that service, and had responded with a letter "one more time to try and get that option."

Ruth Caldera asked why, in the meantime, the mail house was being allowed to deteriorate. Shepherd said the Board was reluctant to invest in a structure that would likely be torn down in a year or so. Caldera said the poor condition of the structure reflected badly on the entire community, and Shepherd said the Board would take

Caldera also asked what the Board was doing to have poorly maintained lawns -- particularly of foreclosed homes with no current occupant -- cleaned up, mentioning in particular one on Owens Circle. Her question touched off a wide-ranging debate on the subject that was hampered by the absence of ARC and Compliance Director Adam Wimberley.

Shepherd, Hoffmann, and Silberhorn all took a stab at explaining that clean up of foreclosed properties is fraught with legal complications, and that spend-

ing Association funds to do sowith little hope that they will be recovered -- was a move that not every resident would support. But a number of homeowners argued that lawns in such poor repair negatively affected everyone's property values. Shepherd said the Board would take another look at the issue.

Caldera asked whether the unsightly traffic barriers on either end of the Lake Auman Dam could be replaced with something more attractive. Shepherd said he would ask Infrastructure Director John Goodman to see if improvements could be made.

Former Treasurer Virgil Reid, after studying the financial reports

distributed at the meeting, asked whether the developer and Beacon Ridge Country Club have stopped paying their share of the cost of guard service at the front gate. "They are in arrears and they are being addressed," President Shepherd replied.

Other Items

Also during the Tuesday, September 22 SLWLA General Meeting:

 Legal Affairs Director Silberhorn reported that the Board will hold a special work session on Friday, September 25, at 9:00 am, to continue its review of proposed changes to the rules and regulations. Links to the proposed revision are available on the Association website. Silberhorn said a final vote on the revised rules is likely in October. The date of the Board's October Work Session has been moved from October 13 to October 20.

- Community Manager Joan Frost said the office staff has been busy this month focusing on compliance issues, including making sure only registered boats, trailers, and other vehicles are using the boat and trailer storage area. Over one hundred compliance letters have been sent out this month, Frost noted.
- President Shepherd noted that the Finance Committee has begun work on a draft budget for Fiscal Year 2010-2011 and will likely bring that draft

to the Board for review in early November, leaving plenty of time for members to review and offer input on the budg-

- Secretary Ed Tuton, who also heads up the Nominations Committee, announced that candidates for the Board of Directions in next March's elections are actively being sought. He encouraged residents to "raise your hand, throw your hat into the ring because we need good people to serve on the Board."

Company profiles

Here are quick profiles of the three management companies selected by the Board to continue into the second round of the selection process, based on the information provided for SLLA member review in the Landowners' Office:

CAS

Community Association Services [CAS] is one of the oldest Home Owner Association management companies in the United States. 
